Survey for Sibling Priority Registration 2018

3. The Primary One (P1) Registration Exercise will be conducted from June to August, with Phase 1 scheduled on 29 - 30 June 2017. Phase 1 is a priority phase for siblings of students who are currently studying in the school and it is only applicable to Singapore Citizen / Singapore Permanent Resident and the child to be registered must be born between 2 January 2011 and 1 January 2012 (both dates inclusive). As in previous years' exercises, the school will be identifying children who are eligible for Phase 1 registration through its Siblings List. The Phase 1 application forms will be given through their elder siblings who are currently studying in our school.

4. To ensure that all children who are eligible for Phase 1 do not miss the Phase 1 registration, we will distribute to **ALL** students a copy of the 2017 Sibling Survey form, Please submit the completed survey form to your child's form teacher, together with a photocopy of the following supporting documents (if applicable):

- a. NRIC of both parents
- b. Birth Certificate / Entry or Re-entry Permits / Singapore Citizenship Certificate for the child entering Primary One in 2018
- c. Birth Certificate of **ONE** sibling (of the child) currently studying in the school and
- d. Immunisation Records for the child entering P1 in 2018

All forms should be returned to the school by Friday, 7 April.

Labelling of personal belongs

5. For ease of identification, we would like to encourage our students to label their personal belongings, such as water bottles, lunch boxes, wallets and bags. Office has collected a number of lost and found items. If you are aware that your child has recently lost items such as water bottles and lunch boxes, please ask your child to identify and claim their belongings from Ms Su at the General Office. All unclaimed lost and found items will be donated to students in Cambodia by 19 May.
