Key Reminders

- 7. <u>Photography and Videography</u>. We would like to reiterate that throughout the course of the year, photograph(s) or video image(s) of you and your child may be captured at all school events. We may use and publish such photographs and/or video recordings in school publications, website, social media channels and other official school communication channels. For clarifications, please feel free to contact the school.
- 8. Attendance and Punctuality. We expect our students to attend school on all school days (unless advised otherwise) and be punctual. Punctuality is a virtue that we aim to instil in our students. We encourage parents to partner with the school in emphasising the importance of being punctual. The reporting time for primary students is 7.30 a.m. However, students are encouraged to arrive by 7.25 a.m. to allow sufficient time to prepare for the flagraising ceremony, which begins at 7.30 a.m. Primary 1 and Primary 2 students will report to the Indoor Sports Hall (ISH), while Primary 3 to Primary 6 students will gather at the Multi-Purpose Hall (MPH). Students who are not seated at the designated assembly area by 7.30 a.m. will be considered late. All primary students will be dismissed at 1.30 p.m. unless they have after-school activities.
- 9. Any absence from school must be supported by a medical certificate (MC) or a letter (including email) from parents. However, the school accepts only up to 5 parental letters or emails per semester to excuse absences. We kindly request that you avoid taking your child out of school for extended family holidays during term time. This helps us safeguard the protected curriculum time for the year.

10. <u>Communications</u>. All official communications with parents will be conducted through Parents Gateway (PG). We encourage all parents to regularly check the notifications sent on PG to stay informed of important information and, where necessary, provide timely consent for your child's participation in school-organised programmes and activities. We urge parents to refrain from contacting their child's teachers after 6.00 p.m. on school days, and on non-school days and weekends, unless the matter requires urgent attention.

Safety, Emergency Preparedness & Student Well-Being

- 11. <u>Attendance and Temperature-Taking Exercise (ATTEx)</u>. An ATTEx will be conducted on 15 January to maintain the school's preparedness to reactivate the attendance and temperature-taking regime. The ATTEx aims to educate your child on personal responsibility for their own health and practise social responsibility. Parents, please ensure that your child brings his/her oral digital thermometer (ODT) on the day of the exercise.
- 12. <u>Fire Evacuation Drill</u>. The school will conduct a fire evacuation drill in Term 1. This is necessary to familiarise your child with the evacuation procedures. The main objective of the fire drill is to safeguard lives by ensuring a systematic and orderly evacuation in the event of a fire. Additionally, fire drills help prevent panic and familiarise students and teachers with the necessary actions during a fire emergency.
- 13. <u>Student Well-being</u>. A recent article in The Straits Times (dated 23 December 2024) reported that Singapore's health authorities are monitoring four diseases as part of efforts to prepare for potential pandemics. These include COVID-19, H5N1, Mpox and a mysterious disease in the Panzi district of the Democratic Republic of Congo. While communicable diseases come and go (with some persisting longer), we must remain vigilant. Given the large gatherings and confined spaces in schools, an infectious cluster could potentially develop from a single source.
- 14. If your child is unwell, please ensure he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention if necessary. If your child is recovering from a respiratory-related illness and must attend school, please encourage them to exercise social responsibility by wearing a mask. Should your child become unwell or develop flu-like symptoms while at school, we will contact you to fetch them. We appreciate your support and will continue to work closely with you. Let us all do our part to exercise personal and social responsibility to maintain a safe environment.
- 15. <u>Road Safety</u>. We seek parents' assistance in emphasising the importance of road safety to your child as he/she resumes his/her routine of travelling to and from school. Please remind your child to always exercise caution and care on the road. Specifically, he/she should:
 - use pedestrian crossings;
 - practise the Kerb Drill when crossing the road;
 - obey traffic signals;
 - avoid crossing in front of stationary vehicles or between vehicles, as drivers may not see them;
 - refrain from running, playing, or using personal devices (such as mobile phones) when crossing the road; and
 - use footpaths and walkways instead of walking on the side of the road.

- 16. The school continues to deploy staff as safety wardens at the 2 traffic light junctions outside the school main gate to oversee students crossing. These wardens will be stationed at both ends of the two crossings during the following times:
 - Morning: 7.10 a.m. to 7.30 a.m. (Far end of traffic lights)
 - Afternoon: 1.30 p.m. to 2.00 p.m. (Near end of traffic lights)

The school will continue to monitor the situation and adjust the duty periods if necessary.

Student Matters

- 17. <u>School-Based Assessment</u>. Assessment is integral to supporting student learning. More than just marks and grades, it provides feedback that affirms students' progress, identifies strengths, and highlights areas for growth. We encourage our students to reflect on feedback from both school-based assessments and class assignments to help them recognise their strengths and act on areas needing improvement. Parents can support this process by reinforcing teachers' efforts to frame assessments as learning opportunities and by affirming your child's progress. The assessment plan for each level will be shared in due course.
- 18. <u>Enriched Learning Opportunity</u>. In shaping the Future of Learning (FoL), the school continues to leverage technology as a capability multiplier to enhance teaching and learning. Since 2024, Primary 5 students have been using the Writer's Toolbox an educational writing portal powered by patented AI and designed to help students improve their writing skills by equipping them to think, plan, and write more effectively. The Writer's Toolbox breaks the writing process into manageable parts, focusing on clarity, creativity, and communication. Given the encouraging results, this programme has now been implemented for all Primary 5 and Primary 6 students.
- 19. <u>Beyond Curricular Activities</u>. Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs) and structured programmes such as Sports Education Programme (SEP), and SwimSafer, are critical platforms for providing students with invaluable life lessons and cultivating essential skills, values, and experiences that enhance learning beyond the classroom. These activities contribute significantly to holistic student development, fostering character, resilience, and a growth mindset. They play a crucial role in shaping our students into well-rounded individuals. We thank parents for your continued support of these CCAs and structured programmes.
- 20. <u>Renaming of Classes</u>. Starting this year, the nomenclature of the classes has been updated to strengthen the connection between our class identities and the 6 school values we aim to instil in our students. Specifically, we have removed the names "Empathy" and "Responsibility" and added "Excellence". Please refer to <u>Table 2</u> for details.

Celebration of Successes...


