- 1. We hoped you had a wonderful family bonding time over the National Day weekend.
- 2. The SBPS Open House 2024, Weighted Assessments, Preliminary Examinations, and PSLE Oral examinations were key and significant milestones this term.
- 3. We continued to invigorate the emergency preparedness of the school with simulation exercises to ensure the readiness of the school population in response to safety and security incident, and has also improved the safety environment with new infrastructure measures.

## **Student Matters**

- 6. <u>Learning for Life Programme (LLP) Student Leadership</u>. Our school's LLP aims to nurture students to be self, peer, and community leaders who advocate and effect positive changes. We believe that leadership skills are essential for your child's holistic development and to be future-ready citizens. All students go through our school-based character education programme which aims to develop in them a growth mindset to lead self effectively and the essential social skills to interact positively with their peers.
- 7. Besides the whole-school approach in character education, the school provides platforms to empower selected students to further develop their leadership competencies, such as through the class committee. We are pleased to inform you that the second team of class committee members has been selected, trained, and appointed for their leadership roles in Semester 2. We look forward to their contributions to the school community as they take on

their leadership responsibilities this semester. We would also like to take this opportunity to thank our Semester 1 class committee members who have served the school since February this year.

8. <u>Head Prefect Election</u>. The annual Head Prefect Election was held on 31 July, where our students and staff cast their votes to elect the Head Prefect. At school, we provided the opportunity for our students to experience a full electoral process consisting of campaigning, cooling off day and the polling day, modelled after the Singapore electoral system. We are pleased to announce that Chan Sau Yeung of 5 Respect was elected as Head Prefect, with Aadriana Marie Domiquil Azril of 5 Resilience and Heng Jane Ling of 5 Respect as Vice-Head Prefects (see <u>Figure 1</u>).

9. <u>Preliminary Written Examination and PSLE Examination Schedule</u>. All P6 students will be sitting for the PSLE and Preliminary Written Examination, starting 13 Aug 2024. As assessment plays an integral role in supporting student learning, parents can help your child to prepare for the examinations by revising with them the components or topics they have difficulties in. Your moral support and encouragement will motivate your child to strive for success. Please refer to <u>Enclosure 1</u> for the details.

## Safety, Security and Well-Being

- 10. <u>First Aid and AED Training</u>. First aid knowledge and skills are essential for one to respond effectively during medical emergencies. Our school prioritises first aid training for all eligible staff. Over 80% of eligible staff are currently trained in Basic First Aid and AED, conducted in the first week of the June school holidays.
- 11. <u>Emergency Preparedness</u>. SGSecure is Singapore's initiative to enhance community resilience against terrorism. It calls on everyone in our multi-racial, multi-religious society to come together to safeguard Singapore and our way of life. Aimed at preparing our students and staff on emergency preparedness, the school conducted a lockdown drill and simulated an intruder incident on 19 July. We are pleased to note that everyone responded appropriately and took the drill seriously.
- 12. Following the intruder drill, our students and staff participated in a fire evacuation exercise to refresh the procedures for evacuating in the event of a fire incident. These exercises served as a reminder of the importance of emergency preparedness and aimed to strengthen our school community's safety and resilience.

- 13. On 3 July, our school also took part in the MOE-wide Attendance and Temperature Taking Exercise. This exercise aimed to (a) ensure the school's readiness to reinstate attendance and temperature taking procedures if necessary, and (b) educate students and staff to take personal responsibility for their health and practice social responsibility.
- 14. <u>Enhanced Safety Measures</u>. Creating a safe environment for our students is a continuous effort. To prevent slips and falls at the concourse, we have installed rain breakers to reduce the risk of wet surfaces during inclement weather. Additionally, the rain breakers provide shade for students gathered at the concourse during dismissal.
- 15. We have also installed safety bollards at the outer perimeter of the Learning Cove to enhance safety (see <u>Figure 2</u>).

16. <u>Safety Reminder</u>. An incident involving a parent and child with a privately owned vehicle recently occurred at the pedestrian crossing traffic light in front of the school. Fortunately, both the parent and child were unharmed. Parents, please remind your child to practice the kerb drill when crossing pedestrian crossings.

#### Celebration of Successes...

17. <u>SBPS Open House 2024</u>. After a 5-year hiatus, the Open House held on 27 July saw a successful turnout of parents. They enjoyed performances by performing arts groups, CCA introductions, student-led booths and school tours (see <u>Figure 3</u> for snippets of the Open House). The successful conduct of the Open House was made possible by the support of parents and students. We are proud of the Sembawang Team, including students, teachers, and staff, for their warmth and hospitality towards our visitors.



Racial Harmony Day 2024 (RHD 2024). Our Primary 18. students engaged in various activities focused on racial harmony in Singapore, including Positive Minutes, presentations, and recess activities on 15 and 16 July. The RHD 2024 celebrations concluded with a skit presentation by our Drama Club students and a food bazaar offering ethnic group snacks such as roti prata, pisang goreng, and ting ting candy on 17 July, where majority of our students came dressed in their ethnic clothing (see Figure 4).

Our students' participation resulted in a total of 30 books being raised for the book drive.
- 24. <u>Choir at the Canberra National Day Dinner</u>. The school choir was invited to perform at the event held at the Canberra Park on the eve of National Day (see Figure 8).



25. <u>NSG Table Tennis</u>. A group of Primary 4 and Primary 5 Table Tennis CCA students took part in the NSG Table Tennis (Junior Division). Our paddlers demonstrated grit, tenacity and emerged as champions in their respective events (see <u>Figure 9</u>).
